The golf season is winding down however the best course conditions are right now.

With fall and cooler morning approaching, we all need to be aware of frosty mornings.

Serious damage can occur to turf if walked on or driven on by vehicles. Frost conditions can happen anytime the temperature gets below 40 degrees. Here is a picture of the effects of frost damage on a green.



Preliminary construction on the



red/yellow tee on 14 has begun. Several trees were taken down and the stumps will be removed shortly. The trees were removed to allow light and air flow to the new tee.

The crew planted six new trees to replace ones that are senescing along 8 fairway, 4 fairway, and behind 16 green. The last tree went between 1 tee and 3 tee. The ones pictures are on the left side of 8 fairway near the big Ash tree.
